How do I get my Teamsters card back?

If you signed a union card and want to withdraw your support:

Simply send an email to the Teamsters explaining that you are revoking your signature on the card. Be sure to include your name, our hospital's name and your contact information (email or telephone number).

Now that I've learned more about the Teamsters, I realize unionization isn't a good choice for me. I wish I hadn't signed.



The Teamsters didn't tell me that it would share my name with other people after I signed a card.

The decision to ask for your card back or remove your signature for authorization is solely up to you.

If you sign a card, make sure you keep a copy for your records.



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Here's sample language you could use in an email to revoke your signature on a Teamsters authorization card:

To Whom It May Concern:
I am revoking my authorization for the Teamsters to represent me for the purposes of collective bargaining and resigning my union membership. Please return my authorization card to the address below. Additionally, please remove my name from future Teamsters outreach efforts and do not sell, rent or otherwise share my personal information with any other labor union or organization.
